

Citation of hEN and EAD in the Official Journal

The EC published recently the <u>update of the list of</u> <u>harmonised standards</u> and the <u>update of the list of</u> <u>European Assessment Document</u>. The new legal approach does not allow the publication of the full list. Therefore, the last publication (under the previous procedure) remains relevant. <u>hEN previous list</u>, <u>EAD previous list</u>. The list of hEN contains some mistakes in the dates, the beginning of the co-existence period of the first group of standards should be 20.03.2019 and the other missing dates should be 20.03.2020, these modifications will be published in a corrigenda.

Consultation on building renovation passports in Europe

Article 19a of the EPBD requests a study on the possible introduction of an optional building renovation passport. EC selected INIVE and BPIE to perform this study. If you want your voice to be heard, you can <u>fill in this survey</u> by April 15 2019. Please note that <u>another survey</u> is ongoing simultaneously for the part of the feasibility study which relates to the inspection of stand-alone ventilation systems. The consortium will organise two stakeholder meetings, in which results on both topics of the study will be shared and discussed. The first stakeholder meeting will take place on 24 June 2019, in Brussels. Save the date in your calendar and <u>register your interest</u> already. <u>Read more...</u>

The European Construction Sector Observatory (ECSO) which is part of DG Growth at the EC, recently published two reports, "<u>Building Information Modelling (BIM) in the construction sector</u>" and "<u>Integrating digital innovations in the construction sector</u>".

Final step for the publication of delegated acts under the CPR

The EC adopted the following delegated acts and sent them for scrutiny of the European Parliament and Council in the coming months: <u>Classification of resistance to wind</u> <u>load performance for external blinds and awnings under</u> <u>EN 13561</u>, <u>technical annex</u>; <u>Classification of air</u> <u>permeability performance for rooflights and roof hatches</u> <u>under EN 1873 and EN 14963</u>, <u>technical annex</u>; <u>AVCP</u> <u>systems for balustrade kits and railing</u>, <u>technical annex</u>. The documents are expected to be published in the OJEU before the summer break.
